Lomilo Prayer Letter: December 2016

"Raindrops on Roses, and Whiskers on Kittens, Bright Copper Kettles and Warm Woolen Mittens,... Silver White

Winters that Melt into Spring, these are a few of my favorite things!..." Waffle and I have many favorite things that God has been blessing us with, and I was remembering them over this Thanksgiving holiday. Looking back in our history, I arrived in Uganda in 1992, fresh from Bible College, excited for the new adventure of ministry in Africa! Language learning, cultural adaptation, meeting new people and developing unique cross-cultural relationships was amazing. Waffle had many wonderful, fruitful years ministering to young people through his Christian Adventure Ministries. Now, it's been great to see how he has immersed himself in our African communities here and poured himself into people's lives. Over the years, God has been able to find ways to use us to draw many people to Himself, with thousands of new believers over the years, and hundreds in discipleship groups now. We praise God for using people like you to come along side us in prayer and support, to enable us to establish ways to bring improved livestock health, higher incomes and more sustainable livelihoods to the communities where we

have been working: breaking through the bonds of poverty to bring hope and wholeness to many families. Implementing these activities with our indigenous ministry, CLIDE, we have found deep companionship and fellowship, and seen the fruit of God's spirit work in and through all of us.

Well, things are changing, it's a "Melt into Spring" time, so we wanted you to be aware of the process that we are going through and the transformation that is ahead of us. It has become clear that it is time to move out from under the wings of Christian Veterinary Mission (CVM). We will still be collaborating with and supporting CLIDE in our same ministries and activities, but Waffle and I hope to be concentrating more on the spiritual aspects of ministry, and not so much on the veterinary or community development side. We will be joining a new mission organisation but remain ministering in our villages in Uganda. CLIDE has gone through an excellent period of growth and development, and is now ready to be emancipated from our day to day presence and oversight. Waffle and I will still live in Karamoja and serve in the villages with CLIDE, but more as close partners rather than being part of the team. We want to encourage all of you to continue your funding of the CLIDE ministries, and even increase during this time of transition, to encourage them! CVM will be receiving and distributing funds for CLIDE and for all of our special projects (Peace ministries, Timothy Education Sponsorships, Livestock Revolving Loans and CLIDE Construction) until June 2017. After June 2017, we hope to have developed an alternative funding stream for them, so that they can be an independent organisation, and not under an international body.
